

# **ST. VINCENT DE PAUL REPORT**

OUR PARISH ST. VINCENT DE PAUL is able to help a lot of people in our community due to your generosity. In the first six months of 2024 \$13,000 of food support was given to families facing food insecurity. We were able to provide \$42,000 to people to avoid utility shut-off, eviction from their homes & money for needed prescription medication. This also helped people get a new job with the help of needed clothing and having the safety of a home. There are 90 dedicated volunteers who show up regularly at our SVDP store in North Vernon to receive donations, sort them and get them on display for purchase. We have a very appreciative customer base who utilizes the many items in the store that are sold at very affordable prices. All this is done with pertinent agency and state and federal guidelines.

As for the monthly report for July 2024 SVDP provided \$17,538.51 in assistance for 98 households and 330 people. Of that, \$3653.05 was for food. Thank you to all who are assisting with this mission. There is great need at this time!
